This day the Court came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and on the Report of Commissioner Hines made May 25th 1876, and the Court after approval and signing said Report, and explaining further to the same as they seemed, it is ordered that the same be returned from the docket.

This day the Court came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read and on the Report of Commissioner Hines made February 1876, and the Court after approval and signing said Report, and explaining further appearing thereon to a case in this case, with order that the same be returned from the docket.

The heirs and executors of J. Edwards deceased
This Court came on this day to be again heard on the papers formerly read and on the Report of John Good Jr. Receiver this day filed, to which report there is no exception, and on the motion of the Executors of J. H. Sumnerill do. by John G. Nitty their attorney for an order directing John Good Jr. Receiver as aforesaid to pay over to them the proceeds of the Bonds of the Bonds themselves which were paid into hand and J. H. Sumnerill, Receiver under their control of May Term of the Court 1868, after having paid the sum of Eleven thousand five hundred and nine dollars and twenty six cents as therein directed, without charging Commission thereon, which motion being argued by John G. Nitty attorney as aforesaid and by said John Good Jr. Nitty for the plaintiffs, the Court deciding that the Commission of the Receiver should be paid out of the sum of Eleven thousand five hundred and nine dollars and twenty six cents and that the payment to said Receiver of Bonds under the control of May Term 1868, by said Sumnerill Court was all that was required and it appearing by the Record that the sum of Eleven thousand five hundred and nine dollars and twenty six cents had been already paid over in Bonds as required, the Court did order the said John Good Jr. Receiver as aforesaid to pay over the sum of ten thousand five hundred and eighty two cents in cash, which appears to be the hands by his report this day filed to the Executors of J. H. Sumnerill or their attorney also the Bonds of J. H. Sumnerill and J. P. Nitty which on the 30th of March 1868 amounted to three hundred dollars and fifty six cents subject to a credit of two hundred and sixty five dollars and twenty three cents on 6th May 1876 and the Bond of John H. Sumnerill which on some day amounted to two hundred and fifty and of thirty four cents also John G. Nitty's Bond which on some day was three hundred and eighty nine dollars & ninety five cents and the Bond of J. P. Nitty which on some day was four hundred and fifty six dollars & eighty cents, and fifty one cents for the same in the case, and nothing further remaining to be done in this case, it is ordered to be returned from the docket.
