This Cause came on this day to be again heard on the papers formerly read and on the Report of John G. Wells &c. made this day filed, to which report there is no exception, and on the motion of the Executors of W. H. Sumner's dec'd. by John G. Wells their atty for an order deciding John G. Wells &c. Receiver as aforesaid to pay over to them the proceeds of the Bonds of the Bonds themselves which were paid into hand and W. H. Wells, Receiver under direct order of Henry Drown of the Court 1868, after having paid the sum of Eleven thousand five hundred and nine dollars and twenty six cents at several divided, without charging Commission thereon, which motion being argued by John G. Wells atty as aforesaid and by said John G. Wells in atty for the plaintiffs, the Court deciding that the Commissioners of the Receiver should be paid out of the sum of Eleven thousand five hundred and nine dollars and twenty six cents and that the payment to said Receivers of Bonds under the direct of Henry Drown 1868, by said Sumner's Court was all that was required and it appearing by the Record that the sum of Eleven thousand five hundred and nine dollars and twenty six cents had been already paid over in Bonds as required, the Court did order the said John G. Wells &c. Receiver as aforesaid to pay over the sum of two hundred fifty four dollars and eighty two cents in cash, which appears to be the hands by his report this day filed to the Executors of W. H. Sumner or their attorney also the Bonds of John G. Sumner and J. P. Wells which on the 30<sup>th</sup> March 1868 amounted to three hundred dollars and fifty six cents subject to a credit of two hundred and sixty eight dollars and twenty three cents on 6<sup>th</sup> May 1873 and the Bond of John G. Sumner which on same day amounted to two hundred and fifty four cents also John G. Wells Bond which on same day was three hundred and eighty nine dollars & ninety five cents and the Bond of J. P. Wells which on same day was four hundred and fifty six dollars and eighty cents, and fifty cents for the sum in the Cause, and nothing further there remaining to be done in this Cause, it is ordered to be removed from the docket.
