This day the cause came on again to be heard on the reports Commissioner Taylor made pursuant to a decree of this Court entered at the February Term 1876 of Thomas J. Dicks' administration account of the A. Hoapfurlong's estate and his account of the assets and several values of the said Thos. A. Hoapfurlong's estate and also a further account of debts outstanding against the same and to which accounts no exceptions have been filed and the charges by account. And consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the said reports be confirmed, and that Thomas J. Dicks junior administrator of the A. Hoapfurlong dec. pay first to James H. Taylor & Co. his Commissioner for and the balance of the money in his hands to wit, the sum of eight hundred and fifty seven dollars and no cents as follows: To James S. Hoapfurlong one bond, pay eighty eight seven dollars to Perry Peckel one bond, three hundred and thirty three seven dollars - to Perry Peckel one bond, eighty seven dollars to Mr. A and C. H. Scatter one account twelve seven dollars to Dicks and Piers one account fifteen seven dollars, to Ch. J. and Th. Kelly eight seven dollars in account, to A. H. Hoapfurlong five seven dollars in account to Hutchins and Davis fifteen dollars in account and to James S. Hoapfurlong two hundred and eighty five seven dollars in account. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree that Thos. J. Dicks junior and Annis his wife, Lucy Hoapfurlong and Robert Hoapfurlong heirs at law of Thos. A. Hoapfurlong dec. on or before the 1st of January 1876 pay the costs of this suit that have accrued since the decree of February 1875 and to James S. Hoapfurlong the sum of thirty one seven dollars to Perry Peckel the sum of one hundred and eighty four seven dollars to Perry Peckel the sum of twenty eight seven dollars to Mr. A and C. H. Scatter the sum of four seven dollars, to Dicks and Piers the sum of five seven dollars, to Ch. J. and Th. Kelly the sum of three seven dollars, to A. H. Hoapfurlong the sum of three seven dollars and to James S. Hoapfurlong the sum of one hundred and eighty five seven dollars. Now Thos. A. Briggs sheriff of Southampton who is hereby appointed Commissioner for that purpose shall after having given twenty days notice of this time and place of meeting, meet at the high court hall in Jones County Court day at Jerusalem for the year 1876, the tract of land containing five hundred and eighty one acres, whereof Thos. A. Hoapfurlong died, eight and fourpence, lying in Southampton subject to the widow Mrs. Hoapfurlong's dower taking from the party having the same land with approach, security and report be forthcoming to Court.

Tapp as his assignee and balance thereof to Perry S. Hoapfurlong pay one fourth part thereof to Benjamin C. Tapp as assignee of J. A. Hoapfurlong and pay the other fourth
