Stuyvesant and the J. Clements who were then appointed Special Commissioners for that purpose shall receive and deliver to the said Benjamin L. Connel, a good sufficient deed of the same with special warranty for the Griffer tract of land to have the said Thos Atherton did, sealed and delivered in the County of Gloucester containing by estimation one hundred and twenty acres more or less, adjacent to the Poor House Land less here.

This cause came on to be again heard on the papers formerly read and with the report of Thos H. Briggs, Commissioner made pursuant to the above made in said cause at the October Term 1774 of this Court - to which report there is no objection, and was argued by Counsel - At Consideration whereof the Court doth confessible said report and it appearing to this Court that in said cause of October Term 1771, there is a Clerical error in directing said Briggs to pay unto the sum of one hundred and twenty six dollars, (the original sum being the payment of one dollar and twenty six cents) it is ordered that said error be and the record is herein corrected, and that said Briggs accounts for one dollar and twenty six cents as in said cause described, and it is further ordered that the said Thos H. Briggs Commissioner abstain receipt of the Clerk of this Court the tile enclosed Bonds of Thos M. Peirce and George C. Bentall of about hundred and eighty five dollars due respectfully the 15<sup>th</sup> of December 1773 and 15<sup>th</sup> Decr 1776 and before the said dates, or before due of the said Thos M. Peirce and George C. Bentall to pay the same in which cause judgment to said plaintiff, and each of the grounds for any costs that may remain unpaid, and the residue together with the said sum of one dollar and twenty six cents now in said Briggs hands, fully to James A. Schenck, J. A. Gell and Jas. Pittard, the sum of five hundred & eighties Two Dollars and interest on three hundred dollars per month from the 1<sup>st</sup> July 1773 till paid (subject to the payment of one hundred & twenty five 75/100 dollars as paid on the 15<sup>th</sup> of March 1775) as apportion by said Briggs aforesaid first turned round, and it is further ordered that at the payment by said Thos H. Peirce of his bonds aforesaid, the said Thos H. Briggs Commissioner as aforesaid is hereby directed to make to said Thos M. Peirce a bill for the same sold under proceedings herein and forwarded by him, and it is further ordered by this Court that said Thos H. Briggs, Commissioner aforesaid after paying the debt and costs as above directed shall pay the residue to the M. Peirce aforesaid of Soc. M. Dorhous no account of claim secured by the said Thos M. Peirce aforesaid in the proceedings as Exhibit D. Which agreement will appear by paper filed in this cause, and made report to Court.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned till tomorrow at ten o'clock.
