This day this court came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read, and the report of Commissioner Taylor made pursuant to an order of the Court entered at the February Term 1875 and to which report no exception having been filed and was argued by Counsel. And consideration thereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the said report be confirmed, and it appearing from the said report that there are no effects in the hands of the Committee C. S. Committee and that the assets and profits of Harsha N. Stephenson's bank are not in five years past the judgment due the Eastern S. Maryland of Virginia. Therefore the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that H. N. Stephenson shall be hereby appointed special Commissioner for that purpose shall after having given at least twenty days notice of the time and place of sale at Jerusalem by public advertisement for such to sell at Jerusalem in some County Court day or festival situated in the highest bidder the tract of land containing one hundred and twenty acres more or less belonging to Harsha N.
