This Cause this day came on again to be heard, on the paper formerly read, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court with adjudge order & decree, that the Commissioner Richard W. Roupes withdraw such books from the papers as are now due, and all the other books, as they may hereafter fall due, leaving his receipt for the same and collect the same and pay first to R. A. Brinton the sum of five hundred shillings three $\frac{1}{4}$ per dollars, with interest thereon from May 1, 1874, at having a debt of this third class, and secondly pay the residue pro rata among all those creditors, who have proved their debts in the reports of Commissioner Sykes, returned to this Court and confirmed of May 1st 1874 and October 17th 1875, they all being debts of the 4th class - and report his proceedings along with the reports to Court, in order to a further decree.
