This day this cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read, the report of Commissioner Tyler, made pursuant to a decree of this Court, entered at the February Term 1775, and to which report no exception have been filed alio was agreed by counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court doth adjudge and order & decree that the said report be confirmed and that the Sheriff of Southampton after having given at least thirty days notice of the time & place of sale by public advertisement at Jerusalem, and Newports and Boykins, proceed at Jerusalem on some County Court Day to sell at public auction to the highest bidder, the following parcels of land & the interest of Benj: B. Kidder therein, whereof he died seized & possessed but eight acres in fee simple, Benj: B. Kidder's life estate in 100 acres of land, it being the closer land of Mrs Chancery, which he purchased, the said Benj: B. Kidder's interest in 831 acres, of land, now held by Mrs Lucy Kidder, his mother for the 831 acres in reversion in fee simple on the following terms: Sufficient cash to pay the costs of this suit and the balance of the purchase money, on a credit of one, two and three years, several annual instalments, taking from the purchaser funds with approved security, carrying interest from the day of sale, retaining the title to the said land until the further order of this Court, and return the said bonds to Court along with his report of his proceedings. And the Court doth further adjudge and order & decree that a Commissioner of this Court, take a further account of Benj: B. Kidder's estate, also take a further account of debts outstanding against the said estate, and report the said account to Court, together with any other matter specially stated deemed pertinent by himself, or which shall be required to be so stated by any of the parties interested.
