This cause came in this Court to be again heard in the papers formerly read in the Report of Mr. Briggs Sheriff or Commissioner on behalf of Wm. W. Reynolds Commissioner. Made pursuant to a decree of this Court at its May Term 1874, to certify the amount due and paid, and to affirm and set aside the Report made by Mr. Briggs Sheriff on the 2d day of March 1874, and it was argued by Counsel, the Consideration whereof, the Court doth Certify and Report and doth further adjudge and determine that unless the said Robert Kirby and wife, or some in law there, shall within the next sixty days pay to your petitioner £1,769.77/- being hundred and sixty nine Pounds sterling and interest to £1,769.77/- per cent from May 6th 1874, back thence the said J. W. Reynolds Commissioner shall proceed to sell by public auction, in some County Court day, before the Consideration Clerk in Exchequer, the Lands due to your petitioner and described in Commissioners Taylor's Report, made pursuant to decree of this Court at its May Term 1874, as the Lands belonging to Robert Kirby and wife, as may be necessary to pay the claim against the said Robert Kirby and wife and that before such sale shall be made, the same shall be advertised in some County Court day preceding to the day of said sale, at the Court House door of said County, and at other public places in said County. And the sale shall be made forthwith following term, to all, enough cash to pay all unpaid cost and the expense of the sale, the balance in a credit to the seller and buyer equally, in equal instalments, bearing Banks Note, approved security from the purchaser, waiving heretofore reciting and retains the title to said lands until the further order of this Court. And that the said J. W. Reynolds Commissioner take papers of the lands belonging to C. F. and L. R. Reynolds and proceed ready stored and published or printed, for one year, after a notice of ten days, at some or more public places in this County, taking bond with approved security payable on the 1st day of January 1878, from the debtor waiving his right to exemption, and reserving the right to distrain, if the sum is not paid in or before the 1st day of January 1878, and make up to costs.
