This day the Cause came on, again to be heard on the papers formerly read, and on the report of Commissioner George W. Clark pursuant to a decree of the Court, Term 1878, to which the Plaintiff had been put, and was argued by Counsel, the Consideration whereof the Court, conforming said Report, doth adjudge, Order and decree, that the said Commissioner George W. Clark, from the papers in this Cause the Certificate of deposit of the Savings and Loan Company of the City of New York for the sum of \$120,000, and also the Plan of J. S. Chauncy and of H. Chauncy in the sum of \$200,000, bearing date the 18th December 1878, and payable three years after date with interest from date, (which said Certificate of deposit he had the Clerk of this Court upon delivery to the said Commissioner H. G. Gooding, upon his executing a receipt for the same, and which the same, and that said Commissioner had paid the costs of this said receipt, Commissioner for and of J. S. Chauncy, of \$5000 and thereon pay to Mrs. L. H. Chauncy the interest collected on the Certificate of deposit and one third of the interest collected on said Plan, and in and in said State Registered Bonds in his name as Commissioner for the benefit of Mrs. L. H. Chauncy for her life, one third of the principal and of said Bonds, and the sum of \$120,000 the principal of said Certificate of deposit, and pay to John J. Hunsford, Guardian ad litem of the Infants Joseph J. Chauncy and C. H. Hunsford, one third of the balance of the interest collected on said Bonds, and one third of one third of the principal of said Bonds, and as much thereof as may be necessary for the purchase of the real Estate referred to in the proceedings for the benefit of the Infants Joseph J. Chauncy and C. H. Hunsford, and the balance of said sums remaining in his hands he must in said State Registered Bonds in his name as Commissioner for the benefit of the said Infants, and pay to Thomas L. Buford and his wife Sally R. one third of the third of the principal and interest collected on said Bonds, and to W. S. Gooding and his wife along with the remaining one third of the third of the principal and interest of said Bonds, and return the said State Registered Bonds to him, with a report of his proceedings. And it appearing to the Court that questions remain the question of an appeal and said State with the same, they paid all the proceeds money, the Court doth order the said W. S. Gooding Commissioner to make and execute to the said William Buford and Sally R. Buford and his wife the same, with Special Warrant, And the Court doth further adjudge, Order and decree, that a Commissioner of this Court take an account of the further transactions of W. S. Gooding as Administrator of Joseph H. Chauncy, and send, state and report the same to the Court, with any papers, specially
