Reale jointly the sum of thirty seven dollars and fifty cents, with like interest, and that all further costs of this suit be paid by the said Henry T. Bryant, James C. Bryant, Charles M. Bailey and Missouri his wife and said Thos. Reale and Caroline V. his wife.
