and decree that W. H. Hazen Sheriff and as such administrator of
Benjamin P. Kindred dec'd, settle before one of the Commissioners of this Court
an account of his transactions as such and the said Commissioner is also
further instructed to take an account of all debts outstanding against
Benjamin P. Kindred's estate and the actual and annual value of the real
estate whereof this the said seized and proposed and reports the said
accounts together with any matter specially stated deemed pertinent
himself or which may be required to be stated by any of the parties
interested.

This day this cause came and again to be heard and the factors formerly
read. The report of James H. Taylor, Commissioner, of Margaret Judkins
administration of James H. Judkins's estate and account of the actual and
annual value of his lands; and account of the debts outstanding against
the said estate of the 28th of April 1876, The report of Commissioner Taylor
dated April 27th 1876 of an additional settlement of Margaret Judkins
administration and the said estate; also the report of J. W. Williams, Joseph
S. Miller, R. J. Watkins and John D. Jones, Commissioners attending same
to the widow Margaret Judkins made pursuant to a deed of this Court entered
of the 11th of March 1875, and to which reports our exceptions have been
filed; a certificate from Margaret Judkins waiving all claims to the Homestead
in the personal estate of her husband and electing to claim the same in real
estate; a receipt filed from A. P. Carshaw and of his legatee of James H. Judkins
for five hundred dollars money received from James H. Judkins and the 3rd
of March 1875 as an advancement and to be brought in the final distribution
of the estate and was argued by counsel; and consideration whereof, and
it appearing to the Court from the report of Commissioner Taylor that there
are no debts proved against the estate and that there is more in the hands
of the administratrix the sum of ten thousand and eighty six 86/100 dollars
ready for distribution. The Court doth adjudge, order and decree that all the
said reports be confirmed and that Margaret Judkins administratrix of James
Judkins' estate out of the sum of ten thousand and eighty six 86/100 dollars
in her hands, by her consent through her counsel, return as her distributee
to Thomas Bird and Christina Bird his wife the sum of six hundred and
thirty 33/100 dollars to John H. Judkins the sum of one hundred and thirty
33/100 dollars, and to A. P. Carshaw and Rebecca Carshaw his wife the

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
