Kindred had owned in fee simple, unsold & with the account of debts regarding it, the Court doth & adjudge, order & decree, that the said W. W. Briggs, after reasonable notice in the neighborhood, and at the Court house, proceed to sell at Jerusalem, in some County Court day, at public auction, to the highest bidder, the said fifty acres of land, in a Credit of W. W. and three years, equal annuities, interest, taking from the purchasee, land with approved security, returning them to Court, & retaining the title until the further order of the Court, & report all his proceedings to Court along with his report, in order to a further decree. And the Court doth further adjudge, order and decree, that Isaac H. Kindred make a further account of his transactions as Administrator of B. B. Kindred dead, before one of the Commissioners of the Court, who will report the same, together with any Matter specially stated, deemed proper to be heard, or which may be required to be stated, by any of the parties, interested?
