They say they cannot come at again to be heard on the property
forming part of the report of Commissioners. In fact, we have presented
to a decree of the Court unless at the sitting June 1877 & to
which report no exceptions have been filed & also agreed by Counsel.
On consideration thereof the Court, confirming the said report
did accordingly Order & decree that that Appraiser, who is hereby
appointed a Special Commissioner for that purpose, shall
