This cause came on this day to be argued heard on the papers formerly read, and on the report of Commissioner J. B. Viguarth made pursuant to a decree of this Court, at its May Term 1799, to which report no exceptions or filed and was argued by counsel. On consideration whereof, the Court doth confirm said report, and doth further adjudge, order and decree that unless the said S. B. and L. R. Viguarth or some one for them shall pay within the next ten days to your petitioners by L. B. Viguarth, M. M. Viguarth and H. B. Viguarth, the sum of five hundred and seventy seven ^{plus} and sixteen cents with interest on five hundred and sixty six ^{plus} and thirty cents, part thereof from May 5th 1796, what then the said J. B. Viguarth Commissioner shall produce & sell at public auction on some County Court day before the Court house door in Jerusalem so much of the lands devised to the children of J. B. Viguarth and described as the lands of L. B. and L. R. Viguarth as may be necessary to pay said claim against said L. B. & L. R. Viguarth. And that before such sale shall be made, the same shall be advertised in our County Court day previous to the day of said sale, at the Court house door and at other public places in the County. And the sale shall be made upon the following terms, to wit: enough cash to pay all unpaid debts and the expenses of this sale, the balance on a credit of twelve and six months in equal installments, taking land with approved security, from the purchaser, arising from the same, and retain title to said lands until the full payment of this Court and under report to Compt.

And the Court do adjudge that the same shall be affirmed upon the petition of the Plaintiff.
