This day the said Cause was at again to be heard in the Registry of the County Court of Probate, Boston, R. & D. Stephens, of Providence, Proctors, made pursuant to C. 1. the decree of the Court entered at the December Term 1877, of a which Report one H. S. Ensign \$500 damages had been filed of was argued by Counsel on Consideration whereof the Court did, Judgment, Order and decree, That the said Report be confirmed, & if it appears to the Court that from the said Report the said tract of Land containing 120^{rs} acres, cannot be conveniently divided between R. W. Clayton & W. H. Ensign, the Court doth further adjudge, Order and decree, that Edward Hickock & Clayton, who is hereby appointed Special Commissioner for that purpose, shall after having given at least thirty days Notice by public advertisement in the neighborhood of the land, and at Dedham, price & sell at Dedham, or some County Court day, at public auction, to the highest bidder, the tract of Land lying in Southampton County known as the Holden tract, (containing) 120^{rs} acres, on the following terms and wit, the said Clerk, be caused to credit of twelve Months, taking from its purchase sum and approved Security bearing interest from the day of sale, returning the bill until the further order of this Court. And the said Commissioner is directed, after paying the costs of this Suit & Sale, to divide the residue of the said payment into two equal shares & pay one share to Richd. W. Clayton & the other share by the lawful Execution of W. H. Ensign & return his receipt, and the defendant shall go to hand to the Clerk along with his Report for its further decree. But the said Edward Hickock & Clayton shall not proceed to sell under the decree, unless he shall have executed before the Clerk of this Court, a bond with good Security in the sum of One hundred dollars, for a faithful performance of this & injunctions decree, which may be entered in this Cause.

Ordered that the Court be adjourned until ten minutes before 7 o'clock.
