It is day the cause came on to be further heard, on the papers forming under the report of N. & McIlwaine and others, filed January 21. 1872, respecting partition of real estate in the foregoing mentioned inscriptions and was argued by counsel. On consideration thereof, the Court considering and it appears, to which there is no exception, doth adjudge, order and decree that J. B. Prince be and he is hereby appointed a special Commissioner for the purpose, that he sell the real estate wherof Henry Kindred that exists, remaining unsold, to wit: The Homestead Tract of 308 acres, and the Phillips Tract of about 825 acres, after 30 days further notice of time and place of sale, such notice to be given at five or more public places in the County of Southampton, upon the following terms, to wit: and to wit: Cash, the balance on a credit one and two years - equal annual instalments, the purchaser to give bonds with approved security, carrying interest from day of sale - and the title to be retained until the whole of the purchase money is paid. But the order is to be suspended until the said Commissioner shall enter into said bond with approved security before the Clerk of this Court, in the sum of five thousand dollars conditioned to execute and make every possible dispatch in this cause - and the said Commissioner will make report of his proceedings to Court.
