 ther decreed in this cause - And the said Court will report  
 his proceedings to Court -

This day this cause came on to be heard on the  
 Complainer's bill, the answer of Mary A. Howell the  
 answer of the in fact defendants by J. C. Edwards Esq  
 ad litem, with general replication thereto - and was ar-  
 gued by Counsel - on consideration whereof the Court  
 doth a Judge order and doth that partition be made  
 of the land of which Alexander Howell died seized -  
 among the parties thereto entitled - viz:  $\frac{1}{4}$  part thereof to  
 C. D. Brown & wife,  $\frac{1}{4}$  part thereof to J. J. King & wife,  $\frac{1}{4}$   
 part to J. O. C. Howell and  $\frac{1}{4}$  part to Alexander Howell  
 and for the purpose of effecting said division, it is de-  
 creed that Luther R. Edwards, James Holmes & F. A. Borden  
 be & they are hereby appointed Commissioners to allot the  
 same - but if partition in their opinion be impracticable  
 then they will report the same with their reasons - the real  
 value of the lands with any other matters deemed pro-  
 per to be determined by themselves or required by the parties
