This cause was this day again heard on the papers formerly
read and on the Report of Wm. S. Goodwyn Exor of Samuel Brown
deceased of the circumstances made of on once in his hands pursuant to
a decree of this Court entered at the May term 1838 and the
report of James C. Tyler Commissioner made pursuant to a decree
of the same term of this Court to Report for exceptions have
been filed and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof
the Court doth adjudge Order and decree that the said Report
be confirmed; and it appearing from the Report of Commis-
sioner Tyler that it is to the interest of the infants this now
Mary E. Kinorid, Joseph D. Kinorid and Le. Antoinette Kinorid
that the offer of Wm. S. Goodwyn Exor as aforesaid to pay to
them the sum of three thousand dollars in full of all de-
mands against him as Executor of Samuel Brown, on
account of his transactions as such prior to the first
day of January 1838, should be accepted; and where-
as it also appears from the said Report of Commissioner
Tyler that the investment of the said sum as a loan se-
cured by a deed of trust on the tract of land of Eleven hun-
dred acres now occupied by E. Wharton alias yet would
be a good and safe investment; the Court doth further order
and decree that the said Wm. S. Goodwyn shall pay to John
J. Kinorid the lawful guardian of the said minor children
the sum of two hundred dollars for his attorney's fees and
shall invest the remaining Twenty eight hundred dollars
in the said tract of land; and shall take from Dolly Chalk
the present occupier and owner of the said tract of land
a Deed of Trust with general warranty & with Wm. B. Shands
as Trustee and a bond with a waiver of the Homestead exemption
payable on demand to the said infant children Mary E. Joseph
D. and Le. Antoinette Kinorid the interest to be paid annually
to John J. Kinorid their lawful guardian for their support -
and the said bond is to be returned to the clerk of the
Court by the said Goodwyn along with his Report, the prin-
cipal of which said bond shall not be paid until the fur-
ther order of this Court. And the said Dolly Chalk shall
be required to covenant in the said Deed of Trust, to insure
the dwelling house which is valuable in some good & reliable
Insurance Company for the sum of fifteen hundred dollars,
and to keep the same so insured during the whole term
the said Deed of Trust shall be in witness for the benefit
of the said infant children in order to receive the said
debt of \$2800. 00 cents: - and the said Goodwyn shall
make the said investments on or before the 20th day of the
present month of November, and when the said Goodwyn
