

children provided that said repairs do not require an additional outlay of more than five hundred dollars and for that purpose he is hereby directed to withdraw from the papers in this suit the bonds for the deferred payment of the purchase money of the lots sold under a former decree and collect the same as they become due and after paying all claims for such other reasonable repairs of the said dwelling house as the necessities of the case may hereafter require, he shall deposit the remainder of the proceeds of sale in the Bank of Portsmouth, in the city of Portsmouth Virginia as directed by a former decree subject to the further order of the Court and the said Commissioner is further directed as he collects the last payment of the purchase money of each of said lots as mentioned in his last report, to execute a deed with special warranty to the purchaser thereof and report to this Court the proceedings herein in order to a final decree.
