

children provided that said repairs do not require an additional out lay of more than five hundred dollars and for that purpose he is hereby directed to withhold from the papers in this suit the bonds for the deferred payments of the purchase money of the lots sold under a former decree and collect the same as they become due and after paying all claims for such other reasonable repairs of the said dwelling house as the necessities of the case may hereafter require, he shall deposit the remainder of the proceeds of sale in the Bank of Portsmouth, in the city of Portsmouth Virginia as directed by a former decree, subject to the further order of the Court and the said Commissioner is further directed as he collects the last payment of the purchase money of each of said lots as mentioned in his last report, to execute a deed with Special Warranty to the purchaser thereof and report to this Court his proceedings herein in order to a final decree.

This case came on this day to be heard on the Complainant's bill taken for confessed as to the defendants Wm. W. Briggs M. D. Butler J. D. Bryant and E. J. Chapman upon the answer of George W. Vick with general replication thereto and the exhibits filed with the Complainant's bill and the answer of George W. Vick, and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree that the defendant George W. Vick do lay before one of the Commissioners of this Court an account first of the personal estate of which the decedent died possessed, and second an account of his administration of said estate who is directed to audit, state, and settle the same and make report to Court with any matter deemed pertinent by himself or which any party may require to be so stated, And the Court doth further adjudge order and decree that notice of the time and place of taking such accounts be published once a week for four successive weeks in one of the newspapers published in the city of Norfolk shall be equivalent to personal
