This day this cause came on to be further heard on the papers formerly read, the report of Commissioners by M. Boughie, C. M. Newson & H. D. Adams, assigning Dower to widow of Richard Williams' decd. & reporting the real estate of said Williams indivisible in kind, to which there is no objection and was argued by counsel, on consideration whereof the Court doth approve and confirm said Report and doth adjudge order and decree, that J. B. Prince who is appointed a special Commissioner for the purpose proceed to sell at Public Auction, after seventy days public notice of time place and terms of sale, the real estate ^{including the premises in the dower} whereof Richard Williams died seized subject to the right of Dower of his widow upon the following terms to wit: one third cash, the balance on a credit of one and two years, the purchaser to give bonds for deferred payment of equal amounts, carrying interest from day of sale and the title to be retained for the further order of Court. But the said Commissioner will not proceed to execute this decree until he shall have entered into Bond before the Clerk of this Court, with security to be approved by him, in the penalty of one thousand dollars conditioned to faithfully execute this and any further decree in this cause. And the said Commissioner will make report to Court of his proceedings under this decree.
