These causes this day came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read, and the petition of Endless Lawrence asking that the lands belonging to the heirs of Henry T. Hobbs deceased be rented out for the year 1881, to pay the debts of the said H. T. Hobbs deceased, and the summons issued at the last term of this Court against Salathiel Lewis to show cause why the lot of land purchased by him under a former decree of this Court, should not be resold in consequence of his failure to pay the bonds for the deferred payments thereof which became due on the 18th day of February 1880. And the said Lewis still failing to appear and show ^{any} cause why this should not be a sale of the said lot of land, and was argued by Counsel on consideration whereof the Court doth adjudge, order and decree, first, that the Sheriff of Southampton County proceed to rent out the lands belonging to the heirs of Henry T. Hobbs deceased, in the Town of Franklin, Virginia, for the year 1881, after due publication thereof in four or more public places in Southampton County, and four successive weeks in the Franklin Gazette, a newspaper published in said County, taking from the lessee bonds with approved security, and return the same to the Clerk's Office of the Court with his report. Second, that the said H. R. Griffin, Commissioner after thirty days notice of the time and place of sale in four or more public places in the County of Southampton, and by advertising the same in the Franklin Gazette a newspaper published in said County, proceed to sell at public auction to the highest bidder, the lot of land purchased by the said Lewis under a former decree of this Court, and situated in the Town of Franklin, Virginia, on the following terms, to wit: one third cash, the balance on a credit of one ^{and}

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
