This day this cause came on again to be
heard on the papers formerly read. The Report of
Commissioners filed during the term reporting
partition of the Real Estate of which Alexander
Howell died seized impracticable and was
agreed by Counsel on consideration whereof
the Court doth adjudge & decree that J. B. Chimer
be & he is hereby appointed a Special Commissioner
for the purpose that he sell the lands whereof
Alexander Howell died seized, after having
given 20 days public notice by hand bills posted
in three or more public places in Southampton
of time & place of such sale, upon the following
terms to wit. One fourth cash the balance
upon a credit of one two & three years, equal
instalments the purchaser to give Bond with
approved security, carrying interest from day
of sale and title retained for deferred
payments. Or if a private sale to advantage
can be made then the said Comm. is authorized
to make such sale & report his proceedings to
Court. But the said Comm. will not proceed to
execute this decree until he shall have
entered into Bond before the Clerk of this Court
in the penalty of \$500. with security to be
approved by him, conditioned to faithfully
execute this and any further decree in this
cause. And the said Comm. will report to Court.

Ordered that Court be adjourned until to morrow
at ten o'clock.
