This cause came on this day to be again heard on the papers formally
 read and was argued by Counsel, on consideration whereof on the applica-
 tion of the plaintiff Emma W. Burgwyn the doct^r pronounced by
 her Counsel, then said: "This is a debt of Burgwyn's not
 mine. I desireing to give the bond required by
 the decree entered in this cause at the May
 Term 1881 and to receive the sum of Four
 thousand Dollars on the terms prescribed by
 said decree, the Court doth adjudge order
 and decree that M. A. B. Ridley Executrix
 and Ch. P. Ridley Executor of Thos. Ridley
 deceased do deposit the said sum of
 Four thousand Dollars in the Exchange
 National Bank of Norfolk Va. Subject
 to the order of this Court in this cause,
 the said sum to be deposited on interest
 at the rate of six per Centum per annum
 from the date of such deposit, And that
 the said Executrix and Executor do pay
 to the said Emma W. Burgwyn the interest
 on the said sum of Four thousand
 Dollars up to the date of such deposit, and
 that they do return to the Court a certificate
 of such deposit and the receipt for the
 interest paid, and upon such deposit and
 payment being made that the said Exec-
 utrix and Executor be discharged from any
 further liability for the said sum to the
 said plaintiff or to any other persons).
 And the Court doth further adjudge order
 and decree that the said Emma W. Burgwyn
 may at any time hereafter apply to the Court
 for an investment of the said fund under
 the direction of the Court, and that she
 may be allowed and is hereby empowered to
 check on the said Bank at the expiration
 of every three months from and after the date
 of such deposit for the interest which may ac-
 crue on the said sum of four thousand
 Dollars, and the further consideration of this
 cause is continued.

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
