In the Circuit Court of the County

day to be heard on the Bill taken for Confess
as to the adult defendants upon whom process
has been duly served, they still failing to
appear. Pleds answer as demurr, upon the
answer of the infant defendants by guardians
ad litem, with general replication thereto, and
was argued by Counsel. On consideration where
of the Court doth adjudge, order and decree
that partition be made of the tract of land
in the bill mentioned of which Wm. Binford
did seise and possessed in the County of
Southampton as follows, to wit, $\frac{1}{3}$ thereof
to E. F. Faison wife of Pembroke Faison $\frac{1}{3}$
thereof to the said Pembroke Faison and $\frac{1}{3}$
thereof to Mary & McCalland infant, orphan
of - Mary McCalland dec. formerly Bin-
ford and for the purpose of effecting such
partition, the Court doth order that A. S.
Hallowman, John J. Bowden, Ransom Maxwell
J. F. Ramsey & J. A. Coker, who are hereby appoi-
nted Commissioners for that purpose, any three
of whom may act, do assign and allot to
the several persons before named, the respect-
ive shares and proportions afore mentioned
by meter and bounds, and if in their opin-
ion such partition of said real estate can not
be made in kind without loss or injury
to the parties, then the said Commissioners
shall report that fact to this Court, and the
reasons upon which their opinion is founded
and the said Commissioners are directed to
make report to Court of their proceedings
under this decree -

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
