

and the exceptions to said report taken by W. B. Ghaisds. Counsel for the Hundred children. And was argued by Counsel. On consideration where of the Court without confirming any of said reports or passing upon the said exceptions, doth adjudge order and decree that W. S. Goodwyn who is appointed special Commissioner for that purpose do withdraw from the papers of the Council upon receipt thereof to the Clerk the three United States Bonds to wit, one numbered 7996 for \$500- dated July 3rd 1878. one numbered 10348 for \$100- dated July 3rd 1878, and the other numbered 10347 for \$100- dated July 3rd 1878- all payable to the said W. S. Goodwyn as executor of Samuel Drowny, and that he collect the same together with any unpaid interest due thereon and deposit the proceeds of said bonds when collected on interest with the Maine Bank of Portland V^a to the Credit of these causes subject to the further order of this Court, and he will make report of his proceedings to the Court. But the said W. S. Goodwyn will not act under this decree until he shall have first executed bond with security deemed sufficiently by the Clerk of this Court in the penalty of fourteen hundred dollars payable to the Commonwealth of Virginia, and Conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duties as said special Commissioner under this or any further decree that may be entered in this cause. And it appearing from the reports filed in these causes, that there are funds belonging to the estates of Samuel Drowny deceased, and of Joseph A. Drowny deceased under the Control of the Court and in the hands of W. S. Goodwyn executor of Samuel Drowny deceased and of the said W. S. Goodwyn administrator of Joseph A. Drowny deceased, and that more than two years have elapsed since the qualification of said personal representative, on the motion of the legatees and distributees of the said Samuel Drowny deceased, and of the distributees of the said Joseph A. Drowny deceased it is ordered that the creditors of Samuel Drowny deceased and the creditors of Joseph A. Drowny deceased do show cause if ^{they} they can on the first day of the November term 1882 of this Court against the payment and delivery of the estate of Samuel Drowny deceased to the legatees and distributees and against the payment and delivery of the estate of Joseph
