This Cause came on this day to be again heard on the papers formerly read therein and on the Report of Commissioner John A. DeBrell being a report of debts due by Warren Edwards etc. filed the 20th day of October A.D. 1879 and on the report of Commissioner Wm. W. Briggs filed the 5th day of November A.D. 1881 being a report of the collection of rents for the land of said Warren Edwards and was argued by Counsel. On consideration whereof the Court doth confirm the two above mentioned reports to which no exceptions have been filed and doth adjudge, order and decree that said Commissioner Wm. W. Briggs distribute the amount in his hands notably among the creditors of Warren Edwards dec'd as they appear by the report of Commissioner John A. DeBrell and that said Wm. W. Briggs make report to Court of any rents he may have collected for the year 1881 or may collect at any time hereafter for said land. And it appearing to the Court that the rents and profits of the land of said Warren Edwards which has not been assigned as dower to his widow are not and will not be sufficient to pay the debts due by said Warren Edwards or his estate within five years.
