This day this Cause came on again to be heard on the papers formerly read  
 and was argued by Counsel. On Consideration whereof the Court on the day of  
 order and decree that William Shands who is hereby appointed a Special  
 Commissioner for that purpose shall after having given at least twenty  
 days notice by Advertisement at Jerusalem and in the neighbourhood  
 of the land, proceed to sell in Jerusalem on some Court day at  
 public Auction to the highest bidder the reversion in the owner of  
 Ann le Bankam formerly wife of James A. Gillette & being a tract of  
 2 1/2 Acres of land allotted to her by a former decree of the Court in this  
 Cause for sufficient cash to pay costs of Sales &c. And the balance of  
 the purchase money on a credit of twelve months taking from the  
 purchaser bond with approved security and return the said bond  
 with his report to Court and the Court doth further adjudge order  
 and decree that one of the Commissioners of this Court take a full  
 true account of debts now outstanding against the estate of James  
 A. Gillette dec<sup>d</sup> and report the same to Court together with any other  
 matters deemed proper and by himself or which he may be required  
 to do to do by any other party interested. But the said Com-  
 missioner shall not proceed to act under this decree until he  
 shall have executed in the Clerk's office of this Court a bond in  
 the penalty of \$300 conditioned for the faithful performance  
 of this and any other decree which may be entered in this  
 Cause
