 And also the report of W. S. Goodwyn Special Commissioner made pursuant
 to the decree entered herein at November term 1880 and filed on the
 15th April 1881 the executing to which taken by Cause of the Hundred Children
 having been withdrawn, And it appearing that the decree entered in
 this Cause at the May term 1882 has been published once a week
 for four weeks in the Norfolk Standard and a newspaper published
 in the City of Norfolk and has been posted at the door of the Court house
 of Southampton County on the first day of two successive terms
 of the County Court of said County and the Creditor of Samuel
 Dewey deceased and his creditors of Joseph A. Dewey deceased
 having appeared and shown Cause against the payment and
 delivery of the estate of the said Samuel Dewey deceased and of
 the estate of Joseph A. Dewey deceased to the distributees and leg-
 ates of said estate respectively, And it further appearing from
 the report of Commissioner James R. Tyler of the transactions of W. S.
 Goodwyn Administrator of Joseph A. Dewey deceased filed on the
 15th April 1882 that the said W. S. Goodwyn Administrator of
 Joseph A. Dewey was on the 19th April 1882 indebted to the estate
 of said deceased in the sum of Eleven hundred and sixty-
 three dollars and fifty four cents (\$1163⁵⁴) with interest at
 nine hundred and nine tyling dollars and seventy four cents
 (\$995⁷⁴) a part thereof on the 19th April 1882 the said the Court
 both adjudge order and decree that W. S. Goodwyn Administrator
 of Joseph A. Dewey deceased do pay to Edward B. Dewey or his
 Attorney the sum of five hundred and eighty one dollar and
 seventy seven cents (\$581⁷⁷) with interest on four hundred and
 one thirty seven dollar and eight seven cents (\$416⁸⁷) a part
 thereof from the 19th April 1882 till paid to be paid of his own proper
 goods and chattels And he pay to Mary Eliza Kindred
 Joseph A. Dewey and Edmund Kindred or their legal guard-
 ians the sum of one hundred and ninety two dollars and ninety
 three cents (\$192⁹³) with interest on one hundred and fifty
 five dollars and ninety four cents (\$165⁹⁴) a part thereof
 from the 19th April 1882 till paid to be paid of his own proper
 goods and chattels and that he pay to Mary A. Goodwyn one
 hundred and thirty three dollars and thirty three cents
 (\$133³³) with interest on one hundred and fifty five
 dollars and ninety four cents (\$165⁹⁴) a part thereof from
 the 19th April 1882 till paid to be paid of his own proper
 goods and chattels and it appearing that the said Edward B. Dewey
 has paid to Nellie R. Dequard in excess of her interest in
 the aforesaid estate and the estate of Joseph A. Dewey
 the sum of nine dollars and twelve cents (\$9¹²) the Court
