This day this cause came on to be further heard
 on the papers formerly read, and the report of W. B.
 Briggs Sheriff filed during the term reporting that the
 value of the land formerly belonging to W. C. loth decd

 by Counsel. On Consideration whereof, one exception
 being filed to said report the same is hereby over-
