 certain deed executed by Benjamin W. Barkham to him
 in 1844 be recommended to the said Commissioners to
 state an account showing what Benjamin W. Barkham
 owes to Joseph S. Barkham under the deed of November
 1844 and also his indebtedness to Jesse S. Barkham, at
 that time, and account by the said deed and the said
 Commissioners will report on the said account to the Court
 together with any matters especially stated deemed pertinent
 by himself or which may be required to be so stated
 by any of the parties interested.
