Dear Mr Johnson -

My mother Mrs Saural V. Barker received your letter of Mar. 7<sup>th</sup> stating that a record of my fathers service with the Confederate Army could not be found. My fathers name is entered on the Records at Richmond as Jacob Baker, instead of Barker (7<sup>th</sup> Va Cavalry Co. H.) I learned that when I joined the U. D. C. Chapter at that place. My sister Mrs C. V. Woodford had a letter from a veteran who served with, or knew of my fathers service. When she joined the State Henry Chapter, U. D. C. at Norfolk she gave the letter along with her application to the President Mrs F. A. Walker. Mrs Walker lost the letter. The letter contained a very good record of my fathers service. Dr. J. L. Maynor is the persons name & I understand he died at Elkins, W. Va some years ago. I will get a sworn statement from Mrs Walker as to the contents of the letter.
