The records show that Richard T. Barnes also borne as R. T. Barnes, not found as Richard Tilman Barnes, Corporal, Company D, 17 Regiment, North Carolina Infantry (1st Organisation) Confederate States Army, enlisted May 22, 1861 for 12 months, age 20 years, occupation a farmer.

This regiment was disbanded and mustered out of service by Special Order, dated March 10, 1862, many of the men re-enlisting for the war in the 17th Regiment, North Carolina Infantry (2d Organization) Confederate States Army, and the soldier enlisted as a Sergeant in Company C, of that organization, March 24, 1862.

He was promoted to 1st Sergeant, May 31, 1862.

Muster roll for September and October 1864, last on file, shows him absent as Orderly Sergeant of the regiment since September 18, 1864.

He was paroled at Greensboro, North Carolina, May 1, 1865, in accordance with the terms of a Military Convention entered into on the 26th day of April 1865.
