Jacob*, do solemnly swear that we are residents of the County of *Southampton*, in the State of *Virginia*, and that *Wesley Bradshaw*, whose name is signed to the annexed application for aid under the act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2, 1902, is personally well known to us, and that we have known her for *40 years*, and know her to be the widow of *Wesley Bradshaw*, who was a soldier (sailor or marine) in the military (or naval) service of Virginia, or of the Confederate States, and that we were soldiers (sailors or marines) in the said service during the said war, and that we were with the said *Wesley Bradshaw*, members of (here state the command and the immediate superior officers thereof) *Wesley Bradshaw*, *Wesley Bradshaw*, and that to our personal knowledge, on or about the day of *1864*, at (here state battle or combat where killed or fatal wound received) *Wesley Bradshaw*, and that to our personal knowledge, on or about the day of *1864*, during the said war (state here whether killed or died as the result of wounds received, or surgical operation therefor) *Wesley Bradshaw*, (if he died after the war, strike out all relating to death during the war and proceed as follows), on or about the day of *1864*, the said *Wesley Bradshaw* died, and that the said *Wesley Bradshaw* was a true and loyal soldier in the said service, and was faithful in the discharge of his duty as a soldier (sailor or marine) in the said service, and that we have no personal interest in the allowance of the applicant's claim.

Bradshaw*, whose name is signed to the annexed application, and who is applying for aid under the act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2, 1902, and that we have known the said applicant for *years*, and that to our personal knowledge she is the widow of *Wesley Bradshaw*, who was a loyal and true soldier (sailor or marine) in the military (or naval) service of Virginia, or of the Confederate States, in the war between the States, and that on or about the day of *1864*, at (here state battle or combat where killed or fatal wound received) *Wesley Bradshaw*, the said *Wesley Bradshaw* during the said war (state whether killed or died as the result of wounds received, or surgical operation therefor) *Wesley Bradshaw*, (if he died after the war, strike out all relating to death during the war and proceed as follows), on or about the day of *1864*, the said *Wesley Bradshaw*, died, and that the said *Wesley Bradshaw* lived as husband and wife up to the date of the death of the said *Wesley Bradshaw*, and that we have no personal interest in the allowance of the applicant's claim.

CERTIFICATE OF PHYSICIAN.

I, *R. H. Heath*, a practicing physician, in the *town* of *Manassas*, in the State of *Virginia*, do certify that I am personally acquainted with *Mary J. Bradshaw*, whose name is signed to the annexed application for aid under the act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2, 1902, and that I attended her husband, the said *Wesley Bradshaw*, during his last illness, and that from my professional knowledge of the cause of his death, I verily believe that his death resulted from *Chronic Disease*.
