for 12 mos.

The Co. was re-organized about June
26, 1862, and formed part of the 15th.
Va. Cav. (formerly the 16th Va. Cav) O.S.A.
R. U. Burgess, (also borne as Richard
M. Burges) Co. A, 13th Va. Cav., O.S.A., is
borne on the muster roll for Sept. &
Oct. 1863, as absent sick in Pospl., a
Private.

His name is not borne on the sub-
sequent rolls for Dec. 31, 1863 to Dec.
31, 1864, (latest on file).

He was admitted to Episcopal
Church Hospl., Williamsburg, Va., Sept.
26, & returned to duty Dec. 1, 1863, a
Private.
