The records show that one Edward F. Cobb (name not borne as Edward Thomas Cobb), private, Co. H, 5th Virginia Cavalry (12 Months, 1861-2, 4th Va. Cav. Mullins' Regt.), Confederate States Army, enlisted March 21, 1862 (also shown as March 22, 1862), at Camp Grice.

Muster roll for March 1 to June 30, 1862 (last on file) shows him present.

In May, 1862, Cos. A, B and I were reorganized and assigned to the 14th Battalion Virginia Cavalry, which subsequently formed a part of the 15th Regt. Va. Cavalry. The other companies were reorganized in June, 1862, and, with Capt. Goodwyn's Independent Company, formed the 16th Battalion Va. Cav., which subsequently became the 13th Regt. Virginia Cavalry.

The records also show that one Edward F. Cobb (name not borne as Edward Thomas Cobb), private, Company A (Capt. Irvin C. Wills), 13th Virginia Cavalry (Col. John R. Chambliss Jr.), Confederate States Army, enlisted March 21, 1862, at Camp Grice, and on muster roll for November and December, 1864, dated Dec. 31, 1864 (last on file), he is shown present.

His name appears as a signature to a Parole of Prisoners of War, given in accordance with the terms of capitulation agreed upon between General Grant and General Lee, on the surrender of the Army of Northern Virginia, April 9, 1865. Parole dated Office Provost Marshal, Dist. of East. Va., April 30, 1865.
