The records show that one James M. Gay, private, Company A, 18th Battalion Virginia Heavy Artillery, Confederate States Army, enlisted June 25, 1861, at Jerusalem.

Muster roll for July and August, 1864, last roll on file, shows him absent, on extra duty as Shoemaker in Quartermaster Department Richmond, Virginia, since December 10, 1863.

His name appears on a receipt roll for pay for September, October, November and December, 1864, which shows that he was paid for service as shoemaker from September 1, 1864, to December 31, 1864.

His residence is shown as Richmond, Virginia, age 45 years.
