# ACT 1900.

## PENSION CERTIFICATE FOR A DISABLED SOLDIER, SAILOR OR MARINE.

(Do NOT use this Certificate for a Widow.)

I, Joshua Johnson, of the County of Southampton, in the State of Virginia, do solemnly swear that I am the identical person named in original or subsequent application, with disabilities therein rated, filed in the Witcham County of Southampton, Va., for aid as a soldier, sailor or marine of Virginia, in the service of the said State, or of the Confederate States, during the war between the States, and that I am now an actual resident of the County of Southampton, in the said State, and that I do not hold any national, State, city or county office which pays me in salary or fees two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per annum; nor do I receive from any source whatever money or other means of support amounting in value to the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per annum; nor do I own in my own right, nor does anyone hold in trust for my benefit or use, nor does my wife own, nor does any one hold in trust for her benefit, either real, personal or mixed property or estate, either in fee or for life, of the assessed value of seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750.00)\*; nor do I receive any aid or pension from any other State, or from the United States, or from any other source, and that I am not an inmate of a soldier's home, and I am without any means of support, either direct or indirect.

## CERTIFICATE OF COMMISSIONER OF REVENUE.
