Yours of March 9th received and in regard to your application for pension which was received in this office August 4, 1921. I beg to say that I have before me a copy of a letter of September 15, 1921 written by Mr. J. J. Johnson, Pension Clerk. It seems that we have never received a reply to this letter. Your claim shows that you are assessed with property valued at \$2455.00. This assessment does not bar you from drawing a pension, provided however, that your income from this source and all other sources amounts to less than \$300.00 per year.
