My dear Sir:-

We have your application for pension, and beg to advise that it shows you draw over \$500.00 a year income. The law does not grant a pension to applicants whose income exceeds \$400.00 per year. You will be permitted however, deduct the cost of fertilizer and seed you have to purchase for your farm the present year and any money you actually pay out for labor other than any one connected with your family.

If after doing this, your income does not exceed \$400.00, please send to this office an affidavit to that effect, as the law requires such a statement in cases like this.
