refused by the auditor as not being payable till the year 1789 it is ordered  
that the treasurer of this county pay unto the said Micajah Holliman  
the aforesaid sum of £10. — &c.

It being suggested to this court that Micajah Holliman had lost or  
mislaid an order on the shf. of this county to pay Mary Windham  
a annual pension of £10. for the year 1789 it is ordered that  
the shf. of this county furnish him with a duplicate of the same  
order on his giving bond and security

Ordered that the c<sup>t</sup> be adj<sup>d</sup> for one hour

At a court of Oyer and terminer held for the county of  
Suffolk after the 14<sup>th</sup> day of June 1793 for the trial of George  
a slave belonging to the aforesay of Nathan Taylor and that  
and a challenge be directed against Mr. Vaughan on suspicion of feloniously  
breaking & entering the meat house of Mildred Turner on the  
night following the 20<sup>th</sup> day of Feb<sup>r</sup> last past and taking thence  
out sundry pieces of bacon to the amount of £20. & for setting  
fire to the said house by which means it was entirely consumed.
