Philip Davis were sworn a grand jury of inquest on the body of  
this county and having received their charge were sent out of  
court and after some time returned and made the following  
presentments (see list) and the grand jury having nothing  
further to present were discharged.

Ordered that Heriot Oak and Philip Davis be summoned to ap-  
pear at the next quarterly session court to show cause why they  
have not appeared <sup>that day</sup> of ~~the~~ as grand jury men.

Ordered that process issue against the several persons presented  
this day to cause them to come at the next quarterly session  
court to answer the said presentments.

It appearing to the court that the recommendations of militia  
officers being made at the last court was not agreeable to  
the acts of congress (the court not having the said acts at  
that time in possession) it is ordered that the said recom-  
mendations be quashed except as to the field officers.

Lazarus Cook, James Maguit, Thomas Vaughan, Humphrey  
Downy and John Taylor jr are recommended to the  
Governor as Captains of the 1<sup>st</sup> battalion of the militia of this  
county and Arthur Hyllewskute as Captain of a company of  
light infantry to the said battalion Robert Taylor Lieutenant and  
Geo. Blount Ensign of the said company of light infantry.

Richard Gelliam, Joseph Blunt, Britain Bryant, Simon  
Coveritt and James Mellar are recommended to the Governor  
as Lieutenants of the 1<sup>st</sup> battalion of this county.

John Joyner, Charles Taylor, Drury Harris, James Turner  
and Richard Clements are recommended to the Governor as  
Ensigns of the 1<sup>st</sup> battalion of this county.
