The commonwealth of Virginia to the justices of Southampton county greeting. Whereas in
a certain cause lately depending in the general court by appeal between John Barrow
appellant & Thomas Turner & Thomas Holliday appellees from an order of the said county
court made the tenth day of July 1788 giving leave to the appellants to turn certain roads
according to the prayer of their petition, it was considered by the said general court that
a road of the said county court was erroneous, and that the same should be removed &
cancelled and the said general court proceeding to give such judgment in the premises as
the said county court ought to have given ~~and~~ under the old road to Smith's bridge
from the place where it leaves the old leading from Taylor's bridge to Southampton
courthouse be discontinued; that the new road to Smith's bridge from whence it comes
the said old road leading from Taylor's bridge to Southampton courthouse be established. That the
appellee Thomas Holliday be at liberty to keep open at his own expence the new road
leading from Southampton courthouse to Taylor's bridge. Yet the Justices of the said county
w^t the premises not regarding how unadvisable & in contempt of the said general court
refused to conform to the said order to the great damage of the said John Barrow as by his
complaint to the judges of our District court helden at Suffolk we are informed.
Therefore we command you that you conform to the aforesaid order of the general court
in this, that you continue the roads established before the tenth day of July 1788 —
except such as were altered by the said General court, and make order for clearing and
keeping the same in repair according to law leaving the said new road to be kept open
at the expence of the said Thomas Holliday, or signify to us cause to the contrary thereof
lest in your default complaint should come to us imputed. And here you shall execute
this our command certify to us in our said District court on the first day of the next
court to be holden in Suffolk returning there thence this writ witness John C Littlepage
dear of the said court the 25th day of October 1793 in the 18th year of the Commonwealth
