This court being informed that the execution of the slaves (belong to
 Harris Spears & Joshua Pettie) called Sam Isaac & Hatter Isaac who were
 condemned for murder on the 26th of November last is still suspended -
 and upon enquiry into the cause of the suspension have received inform-
 lion that a petition and remonstrance was sent to the executive from
 this county setting forth that these negroes were not slaves but free
 men or at least intitled to freedom. The court are of opinion that
 this petition was ^{set forth} founded on vague & unfounded report and an in-
 form that it was signed only by a few persons two only of whom
 inhabitants of this county & that a few of them were present at the
 trial of these negroes - The court further represent that a second
 suspension was caused by the clerks not having mentioned
