of the murder he told Henry the prisoner that they ^{had} got them &
mailed him & Henry asked him for the keys and he replied
that Kuculis had got them the prisoner then said that was
clear that every thing and Henry afterwards obtained the
keys and ^{with others} went to the smoke house and cellar and got several
pieces of meat and brandy & and James Jackson another being
sworn and said that ^{Henry} accompanied him to the place where
and was charged by the other prisoners and the witness that the going and sitting in
Summell was heard. And the evidence being closed being
the murder of the D Summell and was immediately confirmed
closed on the part of the Court and the prisoner being asked
if he had any witnesses to examine or any for the defence to
make to which he replied he had not and the Court on
consideration of the evidence and all the circumstances of the
Case ^{unanimously} are of opinion that the prisoner is guilty therefore
it is ordered that the prisoner ^{be taken} ~~is guilty~~ from hence to
the place from whence he came from thence to the place of
execution And thus on the 20 of the present month between the
hours of 12 and 3 o'clock in the afternoon he hung by the neck
till he is dead
