



The appearance of John Sholor in the suit Duncan Turnbull vs Thomas Jones Esq or Adm'r in the County Court of Southampton -

This Deponent saith that he made application on behalf of Duncan Turnbull to the said Thomas Jones in his lifetime, this deponent thinks some time in the year 1798, for the settlement of his the said Jones amounts with the said Duncan Turnbull - he then told this Deponent that he wished to have his account settled, but that it could not be done with any person but Mr. G. W. Colle, the former attorney of the said company - that after seeing the said Mr. Colle provisions should be made for the payment of the balance - As well as this Deponent remembers the name Mr. G. W. Colle having two or three times on the subject of his debt to the L. Duncan Turnbull and he always assured this Deponent that was the case - The said Jones also informed this Deponent that the said debt should have been paid long before, only for some unfortunate circumstances.
