before the prisoner was at the bar attempted to kill his
master there was some wheat that was in danger of being lost
by the likelihood for rain and when this witness and the
prisoner at the bar were ordered to start that the prisoner
appeared much incensed and went to work cutting and said
that if ever his master attempted to strike him again he
would be dead if he would not kill him dead
and the wind being closed in half of the Cornish
the prisoner was asked if he had any witnesses to examine
or any further or other defence to make to which he replied
he had not and the court on consideration of the evidence
and the whole circumstances are unanimously of
opinion that the prisoner is guilty of ~~the~~ ^{rebellious} plotting
and ~~committing~~ ^{committing} the murder of his said master ~~therefore~~
it is ordered that the prisoner be taken from hence
to the place from whence he came and from thence
to the place of execution and there on the Friday
the 13 of Aug next between the hours of 12 & 3
in the afternoon of that day he being by the neck
till he is dead &c
