Suffolk on the month of May next.

Be it remembered that Alfred Butts, William Foster
Mason Charis and Job Smith, of the County of Hampshire
came into Court and personally acknowledged themselves to be
 indebted to William M. Cabell esq. Governor of this Com-
monwealth and to his successors for the time being in the
sum of three hundred & thirty four dollars each of their
respective lands & tenements goods and chattels to be held
and for the use of the Commond. to be recovered, yet upon this
Condition that the said Alfred Butts, William Foster
Mason Charis and Job Smith do personally appear
at the next district Court to be held on the 1st day
of May next ^{the town of Suffolk} there to give such evidence as they &
each of them know agt. ~~him~~ ^{him} ~~them~~ ^{them} a fraudulent
boy concerning the matters wherein he is charged
that they do not depart without leave of the said Court
then their recognizances to be void.
