informed him that a runaway negro was some where about his house
as he had traced him near his house that on understanding this he
removed all his boots shoes & trowsers in eight two p^r boots and one
worned jacket that about dark he sent two of his boys into the
shop and hearing them make a noise and he immediately run to
the shop and the door being opened he saw his window shutter
open which he had fastened with a nail not more than 20
minutes before the sack hoisted and a stick placed under it
but at this time he missed nothing out of his shop and on
looking round the shop he found a hat under the shop window
and took into his house took up the paper at the bottom and
wrote his name on it and then placed it at the same place
where he found it and that some time in the night Mr
Love sent a negro boy to let him this defendant swear that
he had apprehended a runaway and that he this defendant sent
his boy to look for the hat who said it was gone that
he then went on to Mr Love and there saw the prisoner
whom the J^r Love had apprehended and on examining him
found him to be the prisoner at the bar & that he had one
o^r p^r of long boots which he this defendant immediately knew
to be his & one of the same p^r he had left in his shop & also
a hat which he examined and found to be the same that
he had found under his shop window & written his name in &
