Zebulon Lewis was set to the bar in custody of the Jailor of this County into whose <sup>custody</sup> ~~house~~ he was committed, and the prisoner examined touching the premises, whereupon sundry witnesses were sworn & examined on behalf of the Court ~~to wit~~ <sup>James</sup> Reese, The Court on consideration thereof & of the circumstances attending the case are of opinion that the said Zeb. Lewis is not guilty. and therefore proclamation being made in the manner is, - & It is ordered that he be forthwith discharged.
